Topic: The Emerging Evolution of the IS discipline

Marco De Marco served as a full professor of Organization of Information Systems at Catholic University of Milan for 31 years. Now, he is full professor at University Guglielmo Marconi in Rome. He was elected to be a member of the AIS Council representing Region 2 (Europe, Africa, and Middle East) in 2008. His major research activities have been in systems development, performance evaluation, and organizational change. Later engagements were with public administration, banks, hospitals, city councils, and regional governments with a focus on systems selection, bid preparation, and systems evaluation. He is currently involved in evaluating innovative projects applying for funds either to European bodies or local ones. In 2010, he was awarded the AIS Fellow for his contributions to the IS discipline.
