Keynote Speaker: Geoffrey Dick

Topic: Education -- In the Midst of a Technical Revolution

Dr. Geoffrey Dick currently teaches Information Systems at Georgia Southern University, in the under-graduate, MBA and doctoral programs. Recent positions include Director of the Bachelor of Commerce programs at the University of New South Wales, Professor of Information Systems at Dowling College NY, and Professor of Information Systems at North Georgia College and State University.



He has been on the board of the AIS SIG Ed for most of the last 15 years, three times elected president. He is an ABET Commissioner with expertise in Information Systems programs, a member of the George Washington University Advisory Board for online IS programs, an external reviewer for Information Systems at the Malaysian Metropolitan University, a reviewer on the global textbooks project, a Director of the International Telework Academy, and has recently been a screening editor for the Journal of Information and Management. His research (around 90 publications) is mainly in the areas of telecommuting (his PhD) and on-line education – he is the recipient of an ICIS prize for best paper in education and was awarded the 2009 Emerald Management Review Citation of Excellence for one of the best papers published worldwide in the top 400 business journals. He has been a visiting fellow at UC Davis, the University of Malaya, the Tec de Monterrey in Mexico and Agder University, Norway.

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
