## **WORKSHOP DESCRIPTION:**

## Sustainability and IS. Which one is leading?

The Association for Information Systems Grand Challenge initiative is a call for action for AIS Communities to explore ways to promote discussion within and across communities to promote pedagogy and research that utilizes IS to tackle a major societal issue. In the most recent Grand Challenge AIS links to the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

In the call an important role is assigned to education: education fosters awareness and responsibility within society, empowering individuals to demand sustainable practices from organizations and encouraging the development of eco-friendly information systems.

Many initiatives have already been taken to introduce awareness of Sustainability and Circularity within IS education. In many cases, the focus is on so-called Green IT, which focuses on minimising the impact on the environment by reducing IS's carbon footprint. However, an important role of IS is also to contribute to the 17 SDGs, as mentioned in the UN initiative.

Within AIS SIGED, we pay attention to both lines of reasoning: Of course, we need to focus on minimising the carbon footprint, but with modern IS/IT, we can also contribute substantially to filling the knowledge gap on the other SDGs. In our view, the challenge for education is to find a balance between these two focuses.

In the workshop, we will work on developing a view of how to bring together insights on sustainability in relation to IS/IT. Developing these insights can take advantage of working in a cooperative learning setting and using the knowledge of the workshop participants.
